26–30 July, 1989—FIFTH WORLD CONGRESS OF VICTIMOLOGY, ACAPULCO PRINCESS RESORT, MEXICO: The *objective* of this annual Congress is to provide medical, legal, mental health, justice and social service professionals and other intervenors with the tools and information needed to understand the dynamics of victimization and the consequences of abuse, disaster, and loss; with strategies for short- and long-term intervention and treatment; with an update of current research in the field; and with an agenda for reform.

Papers and presentations on victims of violence, crime, terrorism, accidents, and disasters and on related themes are *invited from all professions* (medicine, psychiatry, law, psychology, social work, sociology, nursing, law enforcement, criminal justice, emergency and crisis intervention, victim & witness services, mediation and arbitration).
